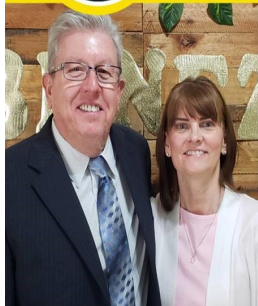

Winning Tech At Home

“Therefore, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.”

— I Corinthians 10:31

This is a powerful exhortation from the apostle Paul that encompasses the entirety of our lives. It reminds us that as believers, our ultimate purpose is to bring glory to God in everything we do. Whether it's eating, drinking, or any other activity, our actions should be driven by a desire to honor and magnify God's name.

The verse begins with the phrase "whether therefore you eat or drink." These everyday activities represent the basic necessities of life. Paul uses these examples to emphasize that even in the most mundane and ordinary aspects of our existence, we have the opportunity to bring glory to God. Our meals, our conversations, and our interactions can all be transformed into acts of worship when they are done with the intention of glorifying God.

The verse continues with the phrase "or whatever you do." This encompasses all aspects of our lives, both big and small. It includes our work, our relationships, our hobbies, and our service to others. No matter what we are engaged in, we are called to do it with the conscious intention of bringing glory to God.

The ultimate goal is to "do all to the glory of God." This means that every action, decision, and thought should be motivated by a desire to honor God and to reflect His character. Our lives are meant to be a reflection of His glory, pointing others to Him and drawing attention to His goodness, love, and righteousness.

To do all to the glory of God requires a shift in our mindset. It means surrendering our selfish desires and seeking to align ourselves with God's will and purpose. It involves seeking His guidance in every decision and endeavor, allowing Him to shape and direct our actions. It requires humility, recognizing that we are not the center of attention, but rather vessels through which God's glory can shine.

Wednesday: I Cor. 6:12; Proverbs 23:26; Job 31:1; Eph.5:8-12

5. While tech has proven to be very helpful in our society it has also become very addictive! How does I Corinthians 6:12 *caution us* regarding this?
6. In relation to question 5 above, tech has proven to be not only very addictive but a popular gateway to sinful behavior. Have YOU been affected by this?

Thursday: I Cor. 9:22b-23; Luke 6:40; Deuteronomy 4:9-10

7. In I Corinthians 9:22b Paul says that he will *“become all things to all men.”* that he might evangelize to them. How can we use tech to evangelize?
8. Luke 6:40 speaks to the example we may set for others. In what way can we use our technology to set a good example for others?
9. In Deuteronomy 4:9 calls us to remember and apply what we have learned. How do YOU use technology to learn and train or “disciple” others?

Friday: Isaiah 28:9-12; Ecclesiastes 5:18
