We Are Dysfunctional, BUT GOD Functions

"Yet your father deceived me and changed my wages ten times, but God did not allow him to hurt me."

—Genesis 31:7

In this verse, Jacob's words reveal the emotional weight of his experiences with Laban. As we reflect on this situation, we can connect it to our own lives. Many times, we may find ourselves in a place of difficulties or unfair treatment by those close to us. It evokes a feeling of frustration and helplessness, which Jacob surely faced. Yet, he understood that God was genuinely with him. We must remember that God sees our struggles and reacts even when we feel trapped.

Jacob's nine years of hard work for Laban showcases great tenacity and dedication. Yet, instead of rewarding hard work with fairness, Laban continually changed the terms of Jacob's wages, leaving him in a state of uncertainty. It can be disheartening to work diligently and not receive the recognition we expect. However, as Jacob articulates in this scripture, it is vital to look beyond our circumstances. When we focus solely on our troubles, we can overlook the hand of God preserving and guiding us through it.

This verse serves as a reminder for us to place our trust in God. He is actively working in our lives, even when we cannot see the way ahead. When Laban tried to undermine Jacob's success, God ensured that Jacob would not suffer harm. God's involvement brought about positive outcomes despite the odds. This leads us to recognize that no matter how dynamic our situations may become, God's plan will always prevail. Our trust in Him is paramount because even through challenging seasons, He is there leading us into His promises.

Another essential aspect of this verse is the idea of character. Jacob's journey teaches us about maintaining integrity. He could have resorted to dishonesty when faced with Laban's tricks, but instead, Jacob stayed true to his calling. We can aspire to similarly honor God in our actions, regardless of the pressures or temptations present in our own lives.
