Make Heaven Crowded By Sending

Romans 10:14 poses important questions regarding faith and the role of preaching in spreading the message of Jesus Christ. When Paul wrote this letter to the Romans, he was concerned about the salvation of the Jewish people as well as the Gentiles. This verse addresses a fundamental truth about faith: belief comes from hearing the Word of God. However, hearing requires that someone shares that Word, and this is where the Church plays a crucial role.

The questions presented in this verse show us the pathway to faith. Without belief, one cannot call upon Christ. Without hearing the truth about Him, belief cannot occur. This leads to the necessity of those who preach—the messengers who bring the good news. Paul emphasizes that the spread of the Gospel is vital for the establishment of faith in others. If no one shares this incredible news about Jesus, how can others ever come to faith and call upon His name?

This verse encapsulates the intricate connection between faith, hearing, and preaching. It reminds us of the responsibility we have as believers to share the hope that we have in Jesus with those who have not yet heard. By understanding this relationship, we recognize the urgency to take action and share our faith with others.

We live in a world where many people are searching for truth and meaning. Often, they may not even realize that they are searching for God. It is our duty to bring the message of hope, love, and redemption to these individuals. We may encounter friends, family members, or even strangers who have never heard about Jesus. How will they know to believe if we don't share it with them?

Additionally, this verse emphasizes the importance of preaching. The act of preaching is not just limited to a pastor on Sunday mornings. Each of us can play an active role in sharing our testimonies and discussing faith in our everyday conversations. We carry the message of Christ within us, and our personal experiences can resonate with those who are struggling or seeking answers.

- 12. In terms of "giving" to the church, What *command* has God Himself laid down before us as His followers in Malachi 3:10?
