David Ask: Where Can I Go From Your Presence

In Psalms 139, the scene is set in a serene and peaceful garden, filled with vibrant flowers and tall trees swaying gently in the breeze. The sun is shining brightly, casting a warm glow over the scene. In this tranquil setting, we find David, the author of the psalm, deep in prayer and reflection. His heart is filled with awe and wonder as he contemplates the greatness and omnipresence of God.

Monday: Psalm 139:7

Introduction

- 1. Who is David calling out to in Psalm 139:7 when he says; "where can I go from Your Spirit?" Whose "presence" can't he ever escape?
- 2. In paragraph 2 on page 1, David comes to the revelation of God's omnipresence. What does he *receive* by knowing his God is ever present?

Tuesday: Jeremiah 23:24; Psalm 139:7; John 4:24; John 1:3

God Is Omnipresent: He Is Everywhere

- 3. Jeremiah 23:24 Our Lord states; "Can anyone hide himself in the secret places, so I shall not see him?" Is it ever possible to "hide" from the Lord?
- 4. John 4:24 says; "God is Spirit, those that worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." How do YOU demonstrate this in your worship?

Wednesday: Psalm 139:8-9; Amos 9:2; I Kings 8:27

God Is Omnipresent: He Is Always With You

- 5. What does Psalm 139:8-9 teach us in regard to the constant presence of God in our lives? Is there *ever* a time when God is not with YOU?
- 6. What do we learn of God's omnipresence in I Kings 8:27? How vast and wide is God? Can He be contained?

Thursday: Psalm 139:1-6, 14-15; Isaiah 43:1; I Cor. 2:9-10

God Is Omniscient: God Knows Everything

- 7. "Oh Lord, You have searched me and know me." What does this statement from Psalm 139:1 reveal to us about God being "all-knowing?"
- 8. Isaiah 43:1 states; "I have called you by your name; you are Mine." Is there someone YOU know who doubts that God knows them?
- 9. Through Psalm 139:5-6 and I Corinthians 2:9-10, how do we see God revealing Himself to us "through His Spirit?"

Friday: Psalm 139:17-18; Psalm 116:12; 2 Cor. 5:14-15; I Pet.2:24

God Is Good

- 10. "How precious also are your thoughts to me, O God! How great is the sum of them." (Ps. 139:17) What do these words tell us about our God?
- 11. What does Psalm 116:12 very plainly state about our God and His generosity towards us? Is He a "giving" God?
- 12. There has been *no greater* expression of love than that which is told in I Peter 2:24 and 2 Corinthians 5:14-15! What did our God do for us?
