Take God To Work

Obviously, the first step to taking God anywhere is to ask Him into your life—not just to be your Savior, but also your Lord. The Bible is the story of His love for mankind, and you in particular. God never intended you to function in this world on a solo basis. He wants to be actively engaged in all parts of your life. 2. What are God’s *clear commands* in both Exodus 20:9 and I Thessalonians 3:10? What do these Scriptures teach us about the value God puts on *work*?

Obeys Your Boss

3. Many of us can relate to a situation where their “boss” is difficult to work with. What does Colossians 3:22 *demand* of us as followers non the less?
4. How is I Timothy 6:1-2 related to this topic of being obedient to the master we serve. How is being obedient to our boss setting an example for others?

Wednesday: Colossians 3:23; Ecclesiastes 9:10; Ephesians 6:6-7

5. What simple message is being conveyed to us in Ecclesiastes 9:10? What does *“do it with your might”* express in regard to how hard we must work?
6. Ephesians 6:6-7 compares *“men-pleasers”* to *“bondservants of Christ.”* How would YOU explain the meaning of both to a new believer?

Thursday: Colossians 3:24-25

Receive Your Reward

7. What promise is given to us who serve the Lord wholeheartedly in our work according to Colossians 3:24?
8. What will come of those who have *“done wrong”* according to Colossians 3:25? What payment will they receive?
9. How often do you feel that you have not received the reward YOU are entitled to? Is it possible that you may need to analyze your efforts?

Friday: Colossians 3:23-24; Ephesians 6:9

Lead With Integrity And Humility

10. What does Colossians 3:23-24 teach us about our Lord and His faithfulness to those who follow Him? Will He ever deny the faithful?
11. While we have talked much about obeying our *“masters,”* what are our *“masters”* called to? How are they called to lead us? (Ephesians 6:9)
12. Who are YOU potentially a *“master”* to in your life? How well are you obeying Ephesians 6:9? Do YOU lead with *integrity* and *humility*?
