Go All In For The Next Generation

The verse from Psalms 78:6 is really important because it speaks to the responsibility of teaching future generations about God's works and His commandments. It emphasizes how crucial it is for us to pass down the stories, morals, and teachings of the Lord to our children and grandchildren. The psalmist is stressing that every new generation should have an understanding of God's deeds and how they relate to our lives. This idea is like planting seeds in a garden: if we nurture and cultivate these seeds of knowledge and faith, they will eventually grow into strong and vibrant plants. This also implies that our own faith and understanding should be so strong that we want to share it with those who will come after us. Each one of us has a role in this ongoing story of faith, and we should be diligent in our efforts to ensure that that story continues.

It's exciting to think about this. We are part of a long line of believers, and we have an opportunity to shape the faith of those who will come next. When we share our experiences with faith, we provide support, encouragement, and a roadmap for our children to follow. Just like heroes of old faced trials and victories, each of us faces challenges and triumphs that can inspire the next generation. Our testimonies and teachings are the tools that build a foundation of faith for our loved ones, allowing them to grow in understanding and trust in God and His plans for their lives.

Reflecting more on this verse brings up many important points. Children are not just future adults; they represent future seekers and holders of faith. It's important that we pass down our faith, but we also need to teach them how to search for their own understanding of God. That is where the generational aspect comes into play. This isn't just about relaying information; it involves molding hearts and minds so that the next generation not only hears the stories of God's greatness but can also recount their own experiences with Him. That duality of experience—that they can both share in the stories of old and also create their own—helps solidify their faith.

Monday: Psalm 78:6

Introduction

1. What responsibility is Psalm 78:6 bestowing upon us as believers regarding the next generation? What *specifically* are we called to pass on to them?
2. Besides passing on our faith to the next generation, what other things do we need to teach them according to paragraph 3 on pg. 1?

Tuesday: I Chronicles 28:9; 28:20

3. What wisdom does King David pass on to his son and future King, Solomon in I Chronicles 28:9? *Whom* must he serve with “*a loyal heart*?”
4. What does Solomon learn from his father about the faithfulness of our Lord in I Chronicles 28:20? Would the Lord ever forsake him?

Wednesday: I Kings 1:28-30; 2:1-4

5. What significant change transpires in regard to David’s throne according to I Kings 1:28-30? Who will be the next King?
6. After David passes his throne to his son, *what specific instructions* does he give to Solomon as to *how* he must proceed if he is to be a successful King?

Thursday: Acts 13:14, 15:39; I Peter 5:13; II Timothy 4:11

Pass On The Faith To Family Members

7. What is revealed to us in the story of Barnabus, Paul and Mark in Acts 15:39? What do we learn about struggle and contention within ministry?
8. What does Barnabus’ actions in Acts 15:39 tell us about his faith in his cousin Mark and his gifts? Who do YOU need to have more faith in?
9. What was the result of Barnabus’ decision to bring Mark along with him on his mission? Did Mark grow to be valuable as a minister? (II Timothy 4:11)

Friday: Acts 16:1-3; II Timothy 1:1-7

Pass On The Faith To Spiritual Mentees

10. What does Paul *find in* Timothy according to Acts 16:1-3? Why does Paul invest his time and effort in the process reflected in verse 3?
11. What do the words of Paul in II Timothy 1:1-7 tell us about his investment and faith in Timothy? How is Paul encouraging him as a “mentee?”
12. Who has been a spiritual mentor to you in your life? How many mentees have YOU passed the faith on to? Who could you be mentoring now?
