Choose Faith Over Fear

Numbers 14:9 is about Joshua and Caleb urging the people of Israel to trust in God’s promise and not fear the inhabitants of the land, emphasizing the importance of faith and courage in facing challenges.

This verse reminds us not to disobey or go against God’s will, even when faced with challenges or intimidating circumstances. WEEKLY READINGS

Monday: Numbers 14:9

Introduction

1. What is the clear message Numbers 14:9 is conveying to us? What are we as followers of Christ to do when fear arises in us?
2. According to paragraph 3 on page 1, why shouldn't we fear people or situations? *Who* is greater than any challenge or adversary we may face?

Tuesday: Matthew 6:22-23; Numbers 13:17-23, 25-26

Recognize The Importance Of What You See

3. Why does Matthew 6:22 refer to the eye as *“the lamp of the body?”* What does Matthew 6:22-23 teach us about the importance of what we “see?”
4. In Numbers 13:17-20 How does Moses use the eyes of the spies as a *lamp*? How is he a model for what Matthew 6:22-23 is trying to teach us?

Wednesday: Numbers 13:27-29, 31

Reject The Traps Of Seeing With Fear: Underestimating God, Scarcity Mentality and Low Self-Esteem

5. What is the contrast between Numbers 13:27 and verse 28? God clearly delivers in verse 27, yet the people are *doubtful* in verse 28. Why?
6. What is the attitude of the men described in Numbers 13:31? Why were they *already defeated* before even seeing their enemy?

Thursday: Numbers 13:32, 14:1-2, 36-37; Hebrews 3:19

Reject The Traps Of Seeing With Fear: Spreading Negativity, Depression & Withdrawal and Missed Opportunities

7. In Numbers 13:31, what impact do you think the men’s negative report had on those receiving it? Was it positive? Why not?
8. What *condition* are the children of Israel clearly falling into in Numbers 14:1-2? How would YOU define their “attitude” toward their situation?
9. Hebrews 3:19 states the outcome brought about by Israel’s “unbelief.” How could that result have been different if their attitude were different?

Friday: Numbers 13:30, 14:9, 38

Reap The Benefits Of Seeing With Faith

10. What kind of attitude is displayed among the people of Israel in Numbers 13:30? Were Caleb’s words able to inspire them?
11. Numbers 14:9 begins with; *“Only do not rebel against the Lord, nor fear the people of the land.”* What are the people of Israel being called to do?
12. How do Joshua and Caleb stand as examples for the Israelites to follow according to Numbers 14:38? Are YOU an example of faith to follow?
