The New You Relationally

The message of Proverbs 18:24 focuses on the importance of friendship and Christ, our ultimate friend.

At first glance, this verse may seem simple, but its implications run deep. It conveys the importance of cultivating genuine friendships and highlights the exceptional nature of a friend who remains loyal and steadfast.

The first part of the verse teaches us that to have friends, we must first be friendly ourselves. <u>True friendships</u> are not built on selfish motives but on selflessness, kindness, and genuine care for others.

The Bible further supports this claim in Proverbs 17 verse 17.

"A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity."

As Christians, we are called to extend love and friendship to those around us, mirroring <u>the unconditional love of Christ</u>. God created us as social beings, designed to thrive in relationships. Hence, genuine friendships provide support, encouragement, and accountability.

Our friendship must not be limited to our dear friends or closest friends, it must go beyond the love of brotherhood but following good examples like Jesus a man of many friends.

Ecclesiastes 4 verses 9 to 10 says,

"Two are better than one because they have a good reward for their labor. For if they fall, one will lift up his companion. But woe to him who is alone when he falls, for he has no one to help him up."

As Christians, we have a responsibility to develop meaningful friendships that can support us in our faith journey. Simply attending church is not sufficient; we should cultivate friendships with fellow believers who share our faith and values. Such friendships align with <u>the genuine teachings of Christ</u>.

They will contribute to <u>our spiritual growth</u> and provide mutual encouragement during both good and bad times. However, it is also important to choose our loyal friends wisely. The company we keep influences our character and can either steer us toward righteousness or lead us astray.
