E. Submission to pastoral authority.

"Remember those who rule over you, who have spoken the word of God to you, whose faith follow, considering the outcome of their conduct."

F. Submission to elders.

Limits to submission: These are time when God's laws and the laws of human authorities are in conflict. In those times, we much choose to obey God's laws over human laws.

HOW TO SUBMIT TO ONE ANOTHER

I. UNDERSTAND THE MEANING OF SUBMISSION

"Submitting" (Ephesians 5:21a)

Submission means to mutually yield your rights and humbly serve one another in love.

E. Submission to government authorities.
