I. RECOGNIZE THE PRIORITY OF COMMUNICATION

Negative consequences of poor communication:

A. Closeness is hindered.

B. Conflicts are unresolved.

C. Confusion is allowed.

D. Christianity is unclear.

Good communication is a two-way street involving free, open talking and careful, attentive listening.

- A. Communication includes talking. Ask yourself these questions:
 - Is what I say both truthful and loving?
