#### III. GOD IS GOOD

A. You cannot count God's goodness.

The fact that God is good means that He has no evil in Him. He always does what is right.

#### HOW TO UNDERSTAND THE NATURE OF GOD

#### I. GOD IS OMNIPRESENT

- A. Omnipresent means God is all-present. He is everywhere at the same time.
  - <sup>24</sup> "Can anyone hide himself in secret places, so I shall not see him?" says the LORD; 'Do I not fill heaven and earth?' says the LORD." Jeremiah 23:24
  - <sup>7</sup> "Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence?" Psalm 139:7

- B. You cannot escape God. He is constantly with you.

## B. God knows you by name.
