A. Peter got better, not bitter.

HOW JESUS HELPS YOU RISE ABOVE FAILURE

I. DEAL WITH THE EMOTIONS OF YOUR FAILURE

A. Peter broke down and wept.

⁷² "A second time the rooster crowed. Then Peter called to mind the word that Jesus had said to him, 'Before the rooster crows twice, you will deny Me three times.' And when he thought about it, he wept."

- ⁵⁹ "Then after about an hour had passed, another confidently affirmed, saying, 'Surely this fellow also was with Him, for he is a Galilean.'
- ⁶⁰ But Peter said, 'Man, I do not know what you are saying!" Immediately, while he was still speaking, the rooster crowed.

Five emotional stages of failure:

- Shock
- Fear
- Anger
- Shame
- Despair

B. Failure is painful.

It's what you do with the grief that matters most. You can give up or grow up.

II. DRAW CLOSE TO JESUS DURING YOUR FAILURE

A. Peter was forgiven by Jesus.

B. Failure is forgivable.

III. DETERMINE THE SOURCE OF YOUR FAILURE

A. Peter failed because he was arrogant.

- ²⁹ "Peter said to Him, 'Even if all are made to stumble, yet I will not be.'
- ³¹ But he spoke more vehemently, 'If I have to die with You, I will not deny You!' and they all said likewise."

B. Failure can be avoided through humility.
